

MB's Linus Split Star Block

2.25" **THANGLES** are used to make this attractive split star block. With **THANGLES** you can make every part of the block from the same strips. You do not need to do a 7/8" calculation and cut for the half square triangles.







With a block of many colors, like this one, you will save lots of time using **THANGLES**.

Block MATERIALS

1/4" seam allowances are used for all seams.

One package of 2.25" **THANGLES**.

To make one Star block, you need the following:

-  Color 1: Cut 1---2.75" x 14" strips.
-  Color 2: Cut 1---2.75" x 14" strips.
-  Color 3: Cut 1---2.75" x 14" strips.
-  Color 4: Cut 1---2.75" x 14" strips.

The quilt takes 12 of the Split Star blocks. To make 12 blocks, you need **48** of the 2.75" x 14" pieces.

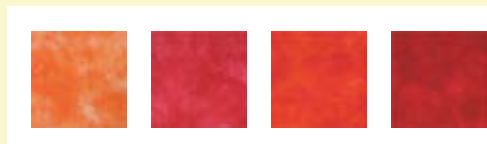
You can also make the blocks from just 4 colors. You need 1/3 yd of fabric of each of the four colors. Cut the following:

- Color 1: Cut 4---2.75" x 14" strips.*
- Color 2: Cut 4---2.75" x 14" strips.*
- Color 3: Cut 4---2.75" x 14" strips.*
- Color 4: Cut 4---2.75" x 14" strips.*

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Block DIRECTIONS

1. Cut one 2.75" square from each of the four colors.



2. Use the 2.25" **THANGLES** and the 2.75" strips to make the following half square triangles (HSTs):



Make 4 HSTs with Color 1 and 3

Make 4 HSTs with Color 2 and 4

B



Make 2 HSTs with Color 3 and 4

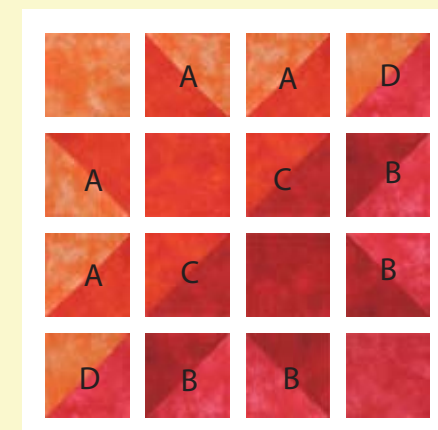
Make 2 HSTs with Color 1 and 2

3. Layout the pieces from **Steps 1** and **2** as shown and sew the block.

It measures 9.5" square, and will finish 9" square when sewn in the quilt.

Make a total of 12 of these blocks.



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
